- 5. "Another Brick in the Wall:" Academy students can paint one of the cinderblock "bricks" comprising the classroom wall. A QR code in the corner allows parents/visitors to hear that student's recorded narrative explaining the thought process behind their painting (Heather Denton).
- 6. Money management: Third and fourth graders explain how they are spending the year in an ongoing simulation; experiencing a lifetime of paying for an education, earning money, tithing, investing, paying bills and taxes, saving for retirement, and much more (John Linhares).
